Student will be required to complete and sign certain forms as provided to their home institution. Please contact your home institution for clarification or for more information.

Academic Information

Grading	Students will receive a letter grade ranging from A to F for each UCLA Anderson course. The letter grade is based on a point/percentage system a student receives for various components in a course. In general, UCLA Anderson students are graded on a curve. The Home Institution will ultimately determine the academic credit and the final grade to be granted to its students for courses completed at the Host Institution.
Courses	Various. Students will be provided a list of courses before the start of the Fall 2017 quarter. Students must enroll in at least 10 and no more than 12 graduate management units for the international exchange. Exchange students will rank their preference of courses. UCLA Anderson will do its best to accommodate each student's course preference, however, cannot guarantee enrollment into his or her top course choices.

Fees

Visa	 UCLA F-1 non degree visa processing fee: \$340 USD (This fee will be directly billed to your home institution) SEVIS 1-901 fee: \$200 USD Visa issue fee at consulate: Please contact your local U.S. Embassy/Consulate for exact cost iSTART orientation fee: \$59 USD (This will be charged to your student account that will be created for you)
Document	Each student will be responsible for a \$50 USD document fee which provides the student an official transcript from UCLA. Once students have been officially enrolled at UCLA, an account will be established and the document fee will be charged to the student's account directly.
Application	Students must pay an UCLA application fee of \$125
Health Insurance	Students must go through UCLA affiliate Garnett-Powers & Associated for insurance purchase or waiver.
Other	Other campus fees may be charged to the student account such as parking, gym membership, etc.



Requirements

Eligibility	All exchange students must be currently enrolled graduate students in a professional MBA program. Each student must have a minimum of 5 years of work experience and have completed at least three terms, quarters, one year of study, or 50% of the course requirements of the degree program, whichever is greater, at their home institution before the exchange begins. Students must also be in good academic standing with their home institution. Please note that some of the courses have prerequisites.
Language	All courses are conducted in English. The home institution will ensure that its nominated students have a good standard of written and spoken English and possess the necessary level of language proficiency required to understand course materials and grasp academic and business concepts. Proof of English language proficiency is required for F-1 non-degree visa eligibility.
Registration	All exchange students will be officially enrolled at the University of California, Los Angeles. An email will be sent directly to the home institution or the selected student regarding the registration process and provide the next steps and documents needed to enter the country for the exchange.
Insurance	UCLA requires all non-degree international students to obtain health, accident, medical evacuation and repatriation of remains insurance that meets at least the following coverage: - \$100,000 per accident/illness in medical coverage - An annual deductible of no more than \$500 - Coinsurance that does not exceed 25% - Medical evacuation up to \$50,000 - Repatriation up to \$25,000 - Pre-existing conditions must be covered with a waiting period no longer than 12 months Insurance policies must cover the non-degree student and all accompanying dependents for the duration of their stay in the U.S. Students must go through UCLA affiliate Garnett-Powers & Associated for waivers or insurance purchase.
Visa	All non-U.S. citizens participating in the 2017 UCLA Anderson International Exchange MUST ARRIVE on an F-1 non degree student visa . A student <u>cannot</u> participate in any courses at UCLA if they arrive in the U.S. with any other type of visa such as a tourist visa or business visa. Instructions on how to apply for the F-1 non degree student visa has been provided to the student's institution and will be sent to the students.
